Readings: Acts 1:15-17,20-26 Psalm 102 1 John 4:11-16 Gospel John 17:11-19

Reflection for this Gunday ...

In his Gospel, Saint John, more fully than the other three evangelists, reports in his own distinctive way the farewell discourses of Jesus; they appear as his testament and a synthesis of the core of his message. Twice in the course of the priestly prayer Jesus speaks of revealing God's name. Jesus thus means to say that he is bringing to fulfilment what began with the burning bush; that in him God who had made himself known to Moses, now reveals himself fully. And that in doing so he brings about reconciliation; that the love with which God loves his Son in the mystery of the Trinity now draws men and women into this divine circle of love. To give one's name means to enter into relationship with another. The revelation of the divine name, then, means that God, infinite and self-subsistent, enters into the network of human relationships; that he comes out of himself, so to speak, and becomes one of us, present among us and for us..

SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

Monday Our Lady of Fatima

The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children at Fatima (Portugal) on the thirteenth day for six consecutive months in 1917. She brought a message of peace and reparation for sin, encouraging devotion to her Immaculate Heart and the recitation of the Holy Rosary.

Tuesday Feast of Saint Matthias, Apostle

(+64) After the Ascension of Our Lord, St Peter proposed that the disciples select an apostle in the place of Judas. They chose Matthias, who joined the eleven Apostles. He worked for the faith in Palestine, and later was stoned to death.

Saturday Saint John I, Pope, Martyr

(+526) He was elected Pope in 523. The Arian King, Theodoric, sent him as his ambassador to Emperor Justin in Constantinople. On his return, he was captured by the King, who was displeased at the outcome of the embassy, and cast him into prison at Ravenna where he died a few days later.


