## Reflection for this Sunday ....

Jesus sent the apostles out. Christianity is always like that. It is never something to be kept to oneself. It always involves an outreach to others. Without that element it would not be Christianity. And it has been proved over and over again that every person is capable of sacrifice. Their mission in the first place was a spiritual one—to preach repentance and the imminent coming of the kingdom of God. But it was also concerned with physical and mental healing. This shows that Christianity is concerned with people's spiritual well-being and with their physical well-being. In other words, with the whole person. They were to bring no material things with them to give to the people. In any case, they probably didn't have them. There is always the danger that if missionaries come loaded down with material gifts the message may be accepted for the wrong reasons. Their message must sell itself on its own merits, and has to be accepted principally for spiritual reasons.

### SAINTS FOR THE WEEK ....

## Monday Saint Bonaventure, Bishop, Doctor of the Church

(1218-1274) St Bonaventure was born in Italy. He entered the Franciscan Order. At the University of Paris, where he was a lecturer, he met St Thomas Aquinas. He became the General of the Franciscan Order and a Cardinal. Known as the 'Seraphic Doctor', he is considered the greatest exponent of mystical theology in the Middle Ages.

Saint Kenelm, Prince of Mercia (Worcestershire)

(821) St Kenelm was said to have been a Mercian prince, who at the age of seven succeeded to the throne of his father, King Kenulph. He was murdered in the forest of Clent by order of his sister Cynefrith. In medieval England he was universally venerated as a saint and martyr. John Sugar studied at the English College in Douai and was ordained a priest in 1601. Having returned to England, he travelled on foot throughout Warwickshire, Staffordshire and Worcestershire, where he ministered to the poorer Catholics. St Robert Grissold accompanied Fr John Sugar, and one day whilst returning after celebrating Holy Mass, they encountered a search party, and they were arrested. They were martyred for their faith. St John Paul II beatified them in 1987.

## Saturday Saint Apollinaris, Bishop, Martyr or of Our Lady on Saturday

(1st or 2nd century) St Apollinaris may have been a native of Antioch. He eventually became first bishop of Favenna, Italy. He was tortured and martyred for the faith and his cult became popular in many places.
