Readings: Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40 Psalm 32 Romans 8:14-17 Gospel Matthew 28:16-20

Reflection for this Sunday ...

Today we contemplate the Most Holy Trinity as Jesus introduced us to it. He revealed to us that God is love 'not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance'. He is the Creator and merciful Father; he is the Only-Begotten Son, eternal Wisdom incarnate, who died and rose for us; he is the Holy Spirit who moves all things, cosmos and history, toward their final, full recapitulation. Three Persons who are one God because the Father is love, the Son is love, the Spirit is love. God is wholly and only love, the purest, infinite and eternal love. He does not live in splendid solitude but rather is an inexhaustible source of life that is ceaselessly given and communicated. To a certain extent we can perceive this by observing both the macro-universe; cells, atoms, elementary particles. The 'name' of the Blessed Trinity is, in a certain sense, imprinted upon all things because all that exists, down to the last particle, is in relation; in this way we catch a glimpse of God as relationship and ultimately, Creator Love. The Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest, according to the order of Melchizedek. In him the Father has been well pleased from before all time. As Mediator between God and human beings, fulfilling his Father's will, he sacrificed himself once on the altar of the Cross as a saving Victim for the whole world. Saturday Saint Justin, Martyr

(+165) St Justin was a philosopher born in Samaria. A convert to Christianity, he was a passionate searcher for truth which he found in Christ. He then defended the Christian faith with his writings, notably 'Apologies' and 'Dialogue'. He was martyred in Rome during the reign of Marcus Aurelius.
